Both groups were then placed in the same escape-avoidance condition: they could avoid the shock if they jumped over a barrier after hearing a tone.

Perhaps the most dramatic evidence that organisms can be aware of the contingency (or lack thereof) between their behavior and reinforcement is found in the experiments on learned helplessness. In a prototypical experiment by Seligman and Maier, dogs were given painful shocks at unpredictable intervals. (①) A control group of dogs could avoid the shocks by pressing the lever, whereas the experimental group could have no means at all to escape the shock. (②) Thus one group of dogs learned a behavior that would eliminate shock, whereas the other did not. (③) Dogs in the control group, which could control their shock in the first phase, readily learned to jump over the barrier. (④) In contrast, the experimental dogs whined and yelped but made no attempt to escape the shock. They had learned that nothing they could do would prevent shock—that there was no contingency between their behavior and receiving shock.
