So what's the source of this mysterious energy? The short answer: feeling good. Positive emotions are bound up with a set of four hormones – endorphins, serotonin, dopamine and oxytocin – which are often labelled as the ‘feel-good hormones’. All of them allow us to accomplish more. Endorphins are often released during physical activity, stress or pain and bring about feelings of happiness and diminished discomfort. Elevated levels of endorphins usually correlate with increased energy and motivation. Serotonin is connected to mood regulation, sleep, appetite and overall feelings of wellbeing; it underpins our sense of contentment and gives us the energy to tackle tasks efficiently. Dopamine, or the ‘reward’ hormone, is linked with motivation and pleasure and its release provides a satisfaction that allows us to focus for longer. And oxytocin, known as the ‘love’ hormone, is associated with social bonding, trust and relationship-building, which enhances our capacity to connect with others, boosts our mood and, in turn, impacts our productivity.

One purpose of assessment is to identify children who may be struggling to learn to read or, for younger children, identifying those who may be at risk of later reading difficulties. In both cases, specific teaching or intervention programs may then be introduced to either provide *remediation or help to prevent reading difficulties. There is some evidence that remediation is most successful when children are treated at a young age; if diagnosis of a difficulty occurs after several years of reading problems, treatment can be less effective. For adults with reading difficulties, assessment may primarily be used for support, rather than remediation, purposes. An assessment of reading might identify a specific reading difficulty, such as **dyslexia, which can lead to recommendations about the support needed in the workplace or learning environment.

Rising over 760 feet at its peak, Diamond Head Crater is a popular destination for hiking enthusiasts and those seeking panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean and Honolulu. The trail to the summit was originally built in 1908 as part of Oahu's coastal defense system and now serves as a path for visitors to explore the crater's interior and summit.
